

The one-year master's programme in Modern Languages is a specialization within the master's in Linguistics at Leiden University. You will be able to focus on one of five modern languages: Chinese, English, French, German or Italian. After completion of the programme you will have acquired unique insights and skills relevant to a career in academia, teaching, writing and communication.

Internship

The MA Linguistics offers students the possibility to exchange one elective for an internship at an organization in the field of language and linguistics, for instance a publisher or the editorial office of a newspaper. An internship abroad is an excellent way of experiencing working and living in one of the countries where the language you study is spoken. You learn how to participate in a project and you acquire practical skills that will be of great value to your future career.
