### **LUCDH Small Grants 2024 - Personal Track awards**

Congratulations to Dr. Susana Valdez, Assistant Professor of Translation Studies, who has been awarded a 2024 Small Grant from the personal development track. With the funds Dr. Valdez has successfully completed a 3-day intensive Advanced Master course, 'Eye Tracking Research Toolbox', organized by Utrecht University.

This training will enable Dr. Valdez to advance her research on the use of Machine Translations by migrants in healthcare settings and on how readers comprehend translated health information. Susana has kindly agreed to teach an eye-tracking workshop in the 2024-5 academic year. LUCDH will be hosting this workshop in our new lab location in Huizinga. 
