Research context

The main purpose of this research clinic will be to produce an edited anthology on the politics of nature education, nature writing, and nature "connection," based on 1) revised reflection pieces from the Ecology Project and 2) new research on topics of interest to the research clinic members (and those authors they might recruit). The anthology will be introduced at a launch event featuring arts, music, and spoken word—most likely to be held in the Spring of 2025.

In addition, clinic members will help plan the next edition of the Ecology Project course. They will also coordinate a handful of nature excursions that will be open to the LUC community and beyond. (It will be possible for Ecology Project alumni to lead these excursions without having to participate in the full research clinic.)

Students' tasks and activities

Research clinic members will:

- Recruit anthology authors and work with them on essay revisions.
- Carry out new research and writing according to their interests.
- Perform copy-editing and page design.
- Work with printers/web platforms as needed.
- Plan, carry out, and/or coordinate nature excursions.
- Review the 2023-24 edition of the Ecology Project and help think towards the next edition.
- Plan the anthology launch event, which will take place in the Spring of 2025.
