
Countries with a National Policy on Open Access










Non-widening and Widening Countries with a National Policy on Open Access




Countries with a Financial Strategy on Open Access









Non-widening and Widening Countries with a Financial Strategy on Open Access




Countries with a National Monitoring on Open Access








Non-widening and Widening Countries with a National Monitoring on Open Access








Countries with National Investments in Open Access







